## GROUND BROKEN IN TOMS RIVER

In February 2022, CSH broke ground on the site of the new Toms River outpatient center. This new facility brings together the outpatient services currently offered at the CSH Toms River Lakehurst Road and Stevens Road sites to one convenient, state-of-the-art location to better serve our patients.

Mark Montenero, CSH Foundation Board of Trustees, capital campaign co-chair, president of Autoland Toyota, Jeep, Chrysler, Dodge and RAM Trucks, and Toms River resident addressed the crowd, thanking the community for coming together to support the capital campaign. “This campaign is garnering support from people all over New Jersey,” said Montenero. “We are so appreciative of their generosity that will give thousands more children access to the specialized care they need.”

Community leaders from across the state were also in attendance, including local officials, RWJBarnabas Health leadership, doctors and leaders from

CSH and the partner facilities, and the CSH Foundation Transforming Lives 2.0 capital campaign cabinet. Todd Frazier, Major League Baseball All-Star and proud Toms River native, his wife Jackie and their son Grant celebrated with us in their role as honorary capital campaign co-chairs.

“When we were presented the opportunity to serve as honorary co-chairs for such an amazing organization, we decided that there would be no better way to give back to our community,” said Jackie Frazier. “The children in Toms River will benefit greatly from this new facility and we are so proud to be a part of bringing them the absolute best care available.”

The lobby of the new Toms River outpatient center will feature an interactive showcase that highlights the life and baseball career of Todd Frazier to inspire all children who enter our doors that they, too, can reach their full potential and achieve their dreams.



# DOORS OPENED IN EATONTOWN

CSH opened its first outpatient facility in Monmouth County in June 2022. This new outpatient center offers convenient access to specialized care for more than 200,000 children who live in the area.

“As a resident of Monmouth County, I am thrilled about the opening of this new facility and the impact it will have for children in Eatontown and surrounding areas,” said Ed McKenna, Senior Partner at McKenna, Dupont, Stone & Washburne and Transforming Lives 2.0 capital campaign co-chair. “Every time I walk into a Children’s Specialized Hospital

facility, I see miracles—and now I will be able to see them happening for children in my own community.”

The new CSH in Eatontown occupies the second floor of the brand new, four-story Anne Vogel Family Care and Wellness Center, an RWJBH facility that provides comprehensive women’s services, pediatric specialty services, wellness education and nutrition resources, specialty surgical services, a blood drawing station and an Urgent Care Center.

## RENOVATIONS BEGAN IN MOUNTAINSIDE

Our historic hospital in Mountainside has been the pinnacle of pediatric specialized care and a beacon of hope for local families for the past 131 years. In addition to the outpatient services provided there, CSH Mountainside is also home to 44 medically fragile children whose conditions are too complex to be properly cared for at home. These children are living with mechanical ventilator dependency, complex seizure disorders, neuromuscular disorders, complications of prematurity, terminal illnesses or a variety of other critical conditions. Our Pediatric Long Term Care Center at Mountainside provides a therapeutic atmosphere, 24-7 specialized medical and nursing care, and a diverse offering of activities designed to provide a loving environment and encourage each child to live to their full potential.

The Transforming Lives 2.0 capital campaign is raising funds to upgrade this very special facility and CSH Foundation marked the commencement of the renovations with a ceremonial “wall-breaking.” CSH and Foundation leadership, members of the respective Boards of Trustees, campaign cabinet members and community leaders were given the honor of swinging the sledge hammers to mark the official

start of the \$19 million renovations that will enhance the future for the most medically fragile children in our care.

“The Westfield community is at the core of the Children’s Specialized Hospital story,” said Philip Salerno III, president and chief development officer at Children’s Specialized Hospital Foundation. “This hospital was founded by Westfield residents in 1891 and over the last century their spirit of caring, kindness and generosity has grown, making CSH the nation’s leading provider of pediatric rehabilitation treating more than 35,000 children each year.”

The renovations will expand the center to house a total of 62 children, offering more families the opportunity to provide their children with the best possible care and quality of life.

“Medical advancements have led to an increase in the number of children living with complex healthcare needs,” said Dr. Sheryl Vassallo, Medical Director Long Term Care at CSH. “The addition of more beds within our facility will afford CSH the ability to provide residential and respite care for this unique and growing patient population.”

Walk n' Roll 16 was held in a new park that boasts incredible scenery, an all-inclusive playground, and even a dog park for our guests who brought their furry friends. Lunch was donated and served by EAT CLEAN BRO and No Body Denied Fitness warmed up the crowd. We had treats from Panera, Rita's, and Mr. Softee for all to enjoy while participating in fun activities at the Kid Zone and dancing to the DJ's music.

The Kaymakian family served as our 2022 Walk n' Roll ambassadors and took the stage to tell Nikos' miraculous story. Diagnosed with Spina Bifida in utero, doctors told Nicole, Nikos' mom, that her son would never walk and have no quality of life. But after his time at CSH, Nikos is walking—and even running—with the assistance of leg braces and his gait trainer.

The 2022 Walk n' Roll raised more than **\$170,000** for the **Transforming Lives 2.0** capital campaign. We were overwhelmed by the support in our comeback year!



# CHILDREN'S MIRACLE NETWORK

## CHILDREN'S MIRACLE NETWORK HOSPITALS PARTNERS RAISE OVER \$1.8 MILLION FOR CHILDREN'S SPECIALIZED HOSPITAL

This year, Children's Miracle Network Hospitals (CMNH) celebrated 40 years of dedication to kids. Since their inception in 1983, CMNH has raised \$7 billion for children's hospitals across North America, most of it \$1 at a time through Miracle Balloon icon campaigns. Its various fundraising partners and programs support the nonprofit's mission to save and improve the lives of as many children as possible.

Being a member hospital of CMNH means that CSH is supported by a national organization that brings awareness to the charitable needs of children's hospitals across the country. CMNH has a large network of national retailers who run fundraising promotions throughout the year that have a real impact for local children.

You may have seen the Miracle Balloon icon at your local Costco, Walmart, Sams Club, Wawa, Speedway, Dairy Queen, Joann, IHOP, Panda Express, or 7-11, among others. Each time a donation is made at a local New Jersey retailer, 100% of the funds come back to Children's Specialized Hospital.

In addition to our retail partners, many colleges and universities support CMNH through Dance Marathons where participants raise funds over a 24 or 48 hour period while they dance the time away! A large network of gamers support CMNH through ExtraLife, playing games to raise funds for kids each year.

Together, our CMNH partners raised more than **\$1.8 million** in 2022 for the **Transforming Lives 2.0** capital campaign.



## OUR 2022 CHILDREN'S MIRACLE NETWORK HOSPITALS NEW JERSEY CHAMPION CHILD: COLBIE

Colbie spent the first 153 days of her life in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) fighting to stay alive. After being born prematurely at 23 weeks, she suffered a bilateral brain bleed and developed hydrocephalus, the buildup of cerebrospinal fluid that places extra pressure on the brain and can cause brain damage.

During her time in the NICU, Colbie underwent seven surgeries— six of which were brain surgeries. At just two-months old, she had a Ventriculoperitoneal Programmable (VP) Shunt placed in the back of her head to help drain the fluid from her brain.

After two years of early intervention and physical therapy, Colbie's parents knew she needed something more and made the switch to Children's Specialized Hospital where she received the diagnosis of Cerebral Palsy which affects her ability to move and maintain balance and posture.

Since coming to CSH Colbie has made great strides learning to use her arm crutches and progress from her gait trainer.

### Colbie has beat the odds every step of the way.

As the Children's Miracle Network Hospitals 2022 New Jersey Champion Child Colbie represented CSH and spent the year advocating for the charitable needs of our hospital and the 170 CMNH children's hospitals around the country. She and her parents, Amanda and Colin, attended the CSH Foundation 6th Annual Open, the Speedway Golf Tournament in Ohio, Wawa Day, and the Kean University Dance Marathon among other fundraising and awareness events throughout the year.





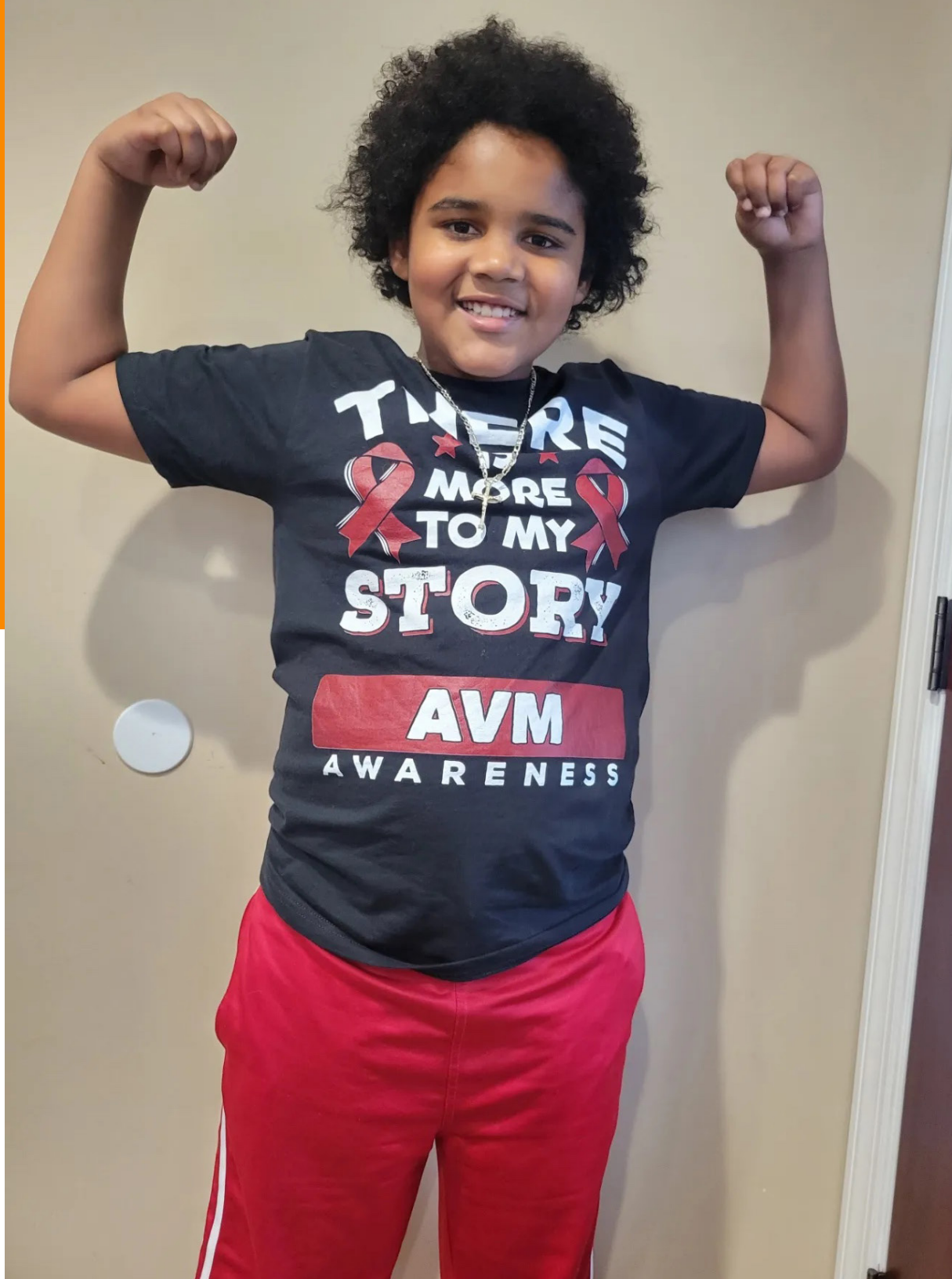
# KIDS CAN BECAUSE YOU CARE

Eight-year-old Tony experienced a sudden and unexpected stroke. With the help of Children's Specialized Hospital, he's got his smile back and is on the road back to doing the things he loves most.

The Blakely family's world turned upside down when their eight-year-old son, Tony, suddenly suffered from a stroke caused by the rupture of an arteriovenous malformation (AVM) in the right frontal lobe of his brain. Tony was rushed into emergency open brain surgery at Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital in New Brunswick, NJ.

An AVM occurs when arteries in the brain connect directly to nearby veins without having the normal small vessels between them. AVMs vary in size and location in the brain. It was later discovered that Tony's AVM resulted from an undetected congenital disability.

Tony showed significant signs of improvement after his surgery and he was soon transferred to Children's Specialized Hospital (CSH) for inpatient treatment. Tony spent exactly three weeks at the inpatient facility learning to sit, stand, and walk again on his own.





“When Tony was first hospitalized I felt crushed, hurt, broken down, and scared that there was a chance that we could lose our son,” added Tony’s father, Shawn. “My hope for Tony is that he can get back to who he was before the AVM rupture.”

“It was extremely nerve-wracking watching our son struggle to do things that were once very easy for him,” said Tony’s mother, Damaris. “However, the staff at CSH--especially the therapists--were very kind, informative, and patient with Tony and our entire family throughout the entire process.”

Damaris describes Tony as a very active child who was involved with his travel soccer team and played recreational soccer six days a week. He also loves football and was looking forward to his first football season before his AVM ruptured. Tony enjoys playing both board and video games, playing outside, and being silly.

“When Tony was first hospitalized I felt crushed, hurt, broken down, and scared that there was a chance that we could lose our son,” added Tony’s father, Shawn. “I truly appreciate all of the staff’s hard efforts and fight for Tony to survive and get back on his feet. We also appreciate everyone always checking in on us as parents as well as for our son as he recovered. My hope for Tony is that he can get back to who he was before the AVM rupture.”

During his time at CSH, Tony made an impression on everyone he encountered with his energetic and fun personality. Tony brought the same enthusiasm he used on the field to excel during treatment. Shortly after beginning treatment at CSH, Tony made great strides.

“As a very active kid, being unable to stand or walk was a huge obstacle for Tony. His biggest goal was to be able to run again. “After surgery, Tony was unable to hold his head up or sit up on his own; he also was struggling to stand and walk--all of which he can now do again,”



said Damaris. “CSH gave Tony back something so simple that we all take for granted daily.”

Dr. Krishan Yalamanchi, who cared for Tony during his stay at CSH, was exceptionally pleased with his recovery and credited his family’s participation in the family centered care we provide. “Tony stayed with us for three weeks and made tremendous progress,” said



Dr. Yalamanchi. “A big contributing factor to his success was his parents being very supportive throughout his entire stay.”

When asked about his experience at CSH, Tony said he rates it one million out of ten. “All of the therapists were special because they believe in you, and it makes you believe in yourself,” he said. “Leaving the hospital was great because I could be home with my family and baby brother, but it was hard, too.” Tony’s favorite part of being at CSH was meeting new people, cooking with his Occupational Therapist, Megan, and aquatic therapy.

“Tony made wonderful progress at CSH during his stay here,” said OT Megan Kret. “He is motivated, hardworking and eager to participate in therapy sessions. He enjoyed incorporating both play and exercise in sessions and left here walking with a big smile on his face!”

Tony has returned to his active, fun-loving, silly self while he continues working hard in his therapy sessions closer to home at the CSH Hamilton outpatient center.

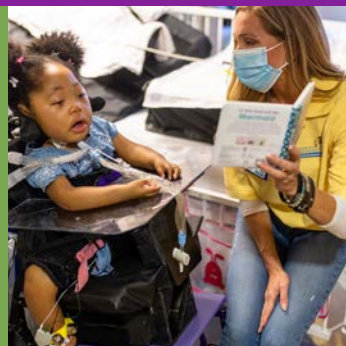

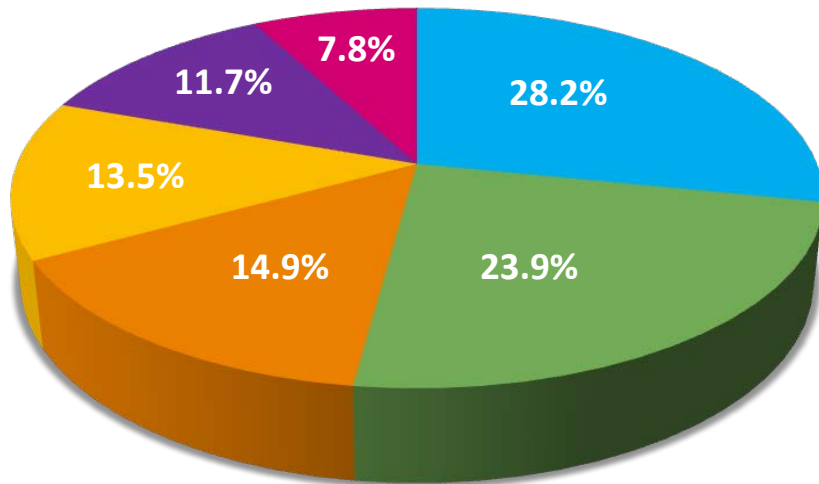

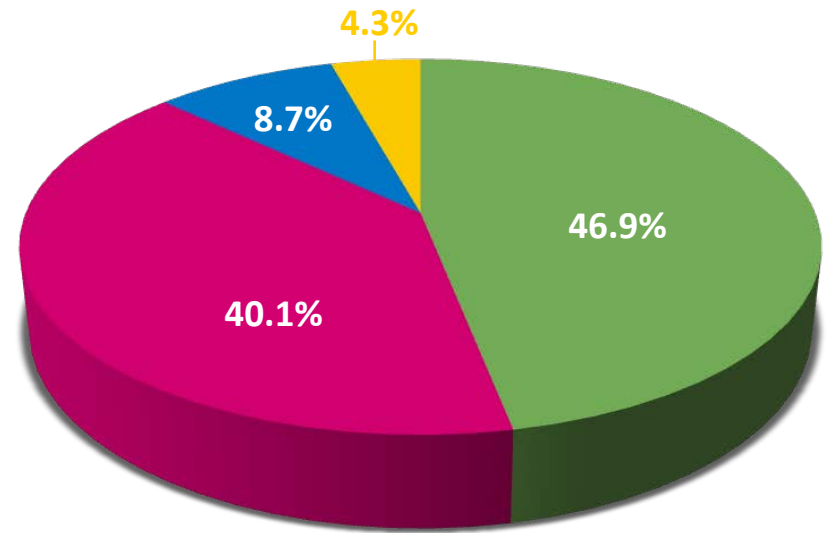
STATEMENT OF REVENUE AND GIFT DISTRIBUTION YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2022

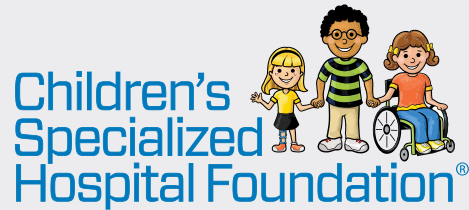
